Employee Appreciation Day is observed annually on the first Friday in March. In 2022, it will be celebrated on Friday, March 4.


Where is Employee Appreciation Day celebrated?

5 ways to make your Employee Appreciation Day special

articles, and social posts. Be sure to use

share with the world! Send a small gift to
employees working remotely to show just
how much their hard work is appreciated.

3. Recognize a team, a department – or your entire company.

Recognizing employees as a group can increase their feelings of belonging and remind them that they are part of something bigger. The recognition might come from the CEO, a department leader, or the company as a whole – but any authentic message of gratitude will help employees to believe that their contribution is truly valued.

4. Set up a video or live event.

Hearing a "thank you" directly from leaders is particularly important and meaningful. Give your leaders the opportunity to speak directly to your employees and tell them how much they are valued.

5. Make a visual impact.
